Ballooning state and federal incarceration is problematic and costly for many reasons, but one ever-increasing complication is the fact that our prison population is aging. According to the Census Bureau, from 1991 to 2021, the percentage of people 55 years or older in our nation's prisons swelled from 3% to 15%, and more than 30% of people serving life sentences are at least

current prison population, what it means to grow old in prison, and present some alternatives to continuing with the current carceral state of affairs.

Alison Guernsey is a clinical professor of law in the UI College of Law. She teaches in and directs the college's Federal Criminal Defense Clinic. Alison received a BA from the University of Michigan (2001) and JD from the UI College of Law (2008).
