





Thank you for providing the UIRA scholarship for students like me at the University of Iowa! I am honored to be a recipient and am very grateful for your support of my academic career.





Big10 Retirees Associations

- 2022 Big10 Retirees Associations annual meeting at Northwestern University
 - Next Big10 meeting hosted by UIRA: ~2034
- Annual Dues
 - Range from \$0 (MSU, Northwestern, Purdue) to \$10/yr (lowa) to \$41/yr (Illinois)
- Pre-COVID Budget:
 - \$5K (Illinois St.), \$7K (**lowa**), to \$81K (Michigan: sponsorships, grants, dues, fees)



Major Issues for UIRA Before This Year

- From 1995-2022, UIRA was the only institution in the Big10 Retirees Associations that did not have a formal affiliation with its university.
- It has been clear for many years that UIRA needed technical assistance to modernize dues collection, provide up-to-date and reliable communications technology, and adopt a modern website and email system.
- This year the UIRA leadership and board members continued the work begun by past presidents and boards to establish a formal relationship with the University of Iowa.



THE YEAR IN REVIEW – MOU Signed



The University of Iowa will:

- Provide and fund 25% FTE effort of an Administrative Service Coordinator (ASC) to maintain UIRA membership, enhance communication capabilities, etc.
- Redesign the UIRA website to include ability to electronically collect dues

The UIRA will:

- Provide content of messages, newsletters
- Raise funds for UIRA Scholarships
- Contribute to student funds as needed, e.g., Student Food Bank, Student Life Emergency Fund
- Provide the Central Administration at least two UIRA program opportunities each year

THE YEAR IN REVIEW – Technology Update

Before this year: Same technology we have used since 1995

- Listserv technology to distribute messages and newsletters to membership
- Often have 30-50 "returned" or "bounced" emails each mailing
- Lois Lembke would correct each error, if possible, often requiring phone calls to UIRA members' homes
- With growth of UIRA, workload unsustainable for retired volunteers



THE YEAR IN REVIEW – Technology Update

Now: Modern, reliable, renewable technology

- 'Dispatch' program with Iowa brand to disseminate information
- Updated UIRA website: modern, easily maintained by ITS, encrypted (https://uira.org.uiowa.edu)
- Relieved traditional workload of UIRA officers and UIRA webmaster through ASC and technology modernization



THE YEAR IN REVIEW – Dues Renewal Update

Before this year: Mail in the dues checks via USPS

- Download and fill out renewal form, then mail form and check to a PO Box via Iowa City USPS
- Form and check collected from USPS by UIRA volunteer Chuck Dayton
- Transaction recorded by UIRA volunteer Lois Lembke, send checks/info to David Fitzgerald (UIRA Treasurer), and eventually transport checks to Hills Bank for deposit



THE YEAR IN REVIEW – Dues Renewal Update

Beginning this year: submit electronic renewals

- On-line electronic dues collection (charge card with 3% fee, or debit card); Secure, encrypted (scrambled)
- Same procedure that the university uses to accept any payment
- Electronically recorded and deposited in Hills Bank (no human intermediary)
- Personal checks will be reluctantly accepted, but this will not be the UIRA standard-of-payment method




THE YEAR IN REVIEW – Submit Renewals

To renew membership

- Receive reminder in August to submit renewal
- Go to the UIRA website (https://uira.org.uiowa.edu)
- Choose one year (\$10) or three years (\$25)
 - Double for couple (\$20 or \$50)
- Renew during September for fiscal year beginning October
- UIRA will send receipt for dues to member
- Fiscal year runs from October 1 to following September 30


