Gingko Tree at the Train Station

A dull sun is trying to shine through the haze on this windy late October day. The pear tree, still fully clad, convulses and then sways in repose for a moment its green leaves still shivering. The honey locust is almost naked. A few yellow boughs hang onto the intricate dark branches as they claw the sky. I sit down and let the colors swoop down over my memories as I inhale the smell of fall in my seventy-fifth year.

A train blows its horn and it takes me to the crowded platform of the old train station in my hometown of Balikesir, Turkey on the day I was leaving to go to university in Ankara.

The red and yellow face of the diesel locomotive appears under the overpass where several children excitedly watch the approaching snarling locomotive until it passes under them and they run to the other side looking down on top of it as it slowly snakes its way to the station. For a moment I wish I were with them, smelling the fumes of the gurgling behemoth. I have been part of that crowd; packs of boys arm in arm, wandering the streets of the town after school, chasing groups of girls, horsing around, snickering, laughing, and arguing about our favorite soccer teams and players. We often would pass through the train station, gawking, clowning, and trying to catch a glimpse of a girl on the train, herself gazing out to relieve her boredom.

Swish and squill of brakes and whistle of the station master jolts the crowd. People carrying suitcases or holding tightly the hands of their children wrestle their way toward one of the open doors of the train. They yield to me as I walk to the train, some are patting me on the back whishing me good luck, some calling me "Ayi," meaning bear, my nickname. I climb the steps, turn around and reach down to grasp the handle of my suitcase from my father. I look down the train car for a seat, and spot one. I pull down the window and lean outside. My parents and brother find me and gather under the window. My mother hands me a box of chocolate covered orange peels to snack on. My father wipes away a tear. I hear a whistle and loud blast of the horn.

Slowly the waving crowd and the platform starts gliding away. I hear the rocking and rumble of switches, the ding-ding bells of crossings as we turn south and leave the town behind. The train speeds through the fertile plain, startled starlings perched on telegraph lines soar; wind dries my tears; yellow and red leaves burst into the air as we pass.
