However, with both careful cost control and the economies achieved by the e-mail distribution of *The Gray Hawk*, we were able to keep the dues at \$10.

I would like to thank UIRA members for allowing me to serve you for four years: two years as a director and one year each as President Elect and President. There were challenges and things like floods to deal with. However, there were also some wonderful memories that resulted from working with an outstanding group of retirees.
